But, most important of all: Ramah makes Jews.







PROGRAM TRACKS

BERT B. WEINSTEIN INSTITUTE

The Bert B. Weinstein Institute is the National Ramah Commission's signature counselor training and leadership program for incoming senior counselors. Participants work with Ramah directors and senior staff to hone critical skills, enhance programming, and share best practices from across the Ramah movement.

VATIKIM: LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE

The Vatikim Leadership Institute is a program designed for experienced senior counselors. Geared toward upperclassmen (returning for their third summer as a counselor), this track focuses on more advanced topics of culture-building, staff dynamics, mentorship, and other leadership development skills.

TIKVAH

Tikvah is Ramah's movement-wide network of programs for children, teens, and young adults with disabilities. Our National Ramah Tikvah Network training includes staff members working as Tikvah counselors, as well as staff dedicated to vocational education and inclusion in other edot. Our Tikvah staff participants at the conference will be focusing on strategies and educational methods relating to building daily routines, nurturing independent living skills, collaboration with families, and strengthening inclusion efforts.

RASHEI EDAH

Rashei Edah are division leaders who will be returning to camp as supervisors this coming summer. At the conference, they will be learning from Ramah senior staff, leading and facilitating sessions for other cohorts, and overseeing components of the Weinstein Institute, providing them with hands-on opportunities to practice organization and executive functioning in a camp environment.

RAMAH COLLEGE NETWORK

Ramah College Network (RCN) Fellows implement Ramah community events on their university campuses. Events range from Shabbat and holiday celebrations to social and learning opportunities. At the conference, RCN Fellows will develop leadership skills and applications for community engagement on campus.

RAMAH SERVICE CORPS

Ramah Service Corps (RSC) Fellows work in Jewish educational institutions, creating experiential programs, as well as assisting with local recruitment efforts. At the conference, the RSC cohort will reflect on their past semester of work, brainstorm effective programming, share fellowship models from their respective sites, and develop new educational resources to bring back to their home communities.

To me Weinstein isn't about learning how to be a better camp counselor, Weinstein is about discovering that there are at least a hundred other people who care just as much about Judaism, care just as strongly about Ramah, and are motivated to have deep, personal conversations about how we can effect change.

Rachael works as the year round director of camper care and staff development for Camp Ramah in the Poconos. She holds an MSW from University of Maryland, School of Social Work and is a certified thanatologist, specializing in grief and loss. She spent many years at camp as a camper, staff member and also served on the board of directors. Rachael met her husband Josh at camp, and their two boys are proud Poconos campers.



Rabbi Jordan is the director of Camp Ramah in Canada. Rabbi Jordan was ordained by the Reconstructionist Rabbinical College, has a B.A. in Conservation Biology from the University of Wisconsin, and is an alumnus of the National Outdoor Leadership School. He is also a recipient of the prestigious Covenant Foundation Pomegranate Prize, which recognizes emerging leaders in the field of Jewish education.



Eliav is the executive director of Ramah in the Rockies. A native of the Boston area and former Boy Scout, he has spent 11 summers working in other Ramah camps, including 5 years at Camp Ramah in Canada. Ordained as rabbi by JTS in 2009, where he also received his BA and MA in Jewish Education, Eliav has been awarded the Pomegranate Prize by the Covenant Foundation and is a Schusterman Senior Fellow.



Julia is the assistant director of Ramah in the Rockies. Originally from Seattle, Julia attended the Nativ College Leadership Program in Israel before earning dual BA's in Earth Sciences and Talmud from Columbia University and JTS. She is an alumna of the Foundation for Jewish Camp's Yitro Leadership Program and the Yeshivat Hadar Fellowship. Julia's husband, Jacob, joins her at camp each summer.



Jacob is the executive director of Camp Ramah in Wisconsin, and a lifetime Ramahnik. A member of the year-round staff since January of 2007, Jacob previously served as Director, Assistant Director, among other staff roles. An alumnus of the Wexner Graduate Fellowship, University of Pennsylvania, and JTS, Jacob is an advanced Ph.D. student in Jewish Studies and Education at Brandeis University.



Erez is the marketing and communications associate at the National Ramah Commission. Erez worked at Camp Ramah in Nyack for many summers, as a madrich, rosh keif and as a rosh edah. Originally from Westchester, Erez graduated from Binghamton University with a degree in graphic design and a minor in Israel studies and now lives in New York City.



Prior to taking on the role as Director at Camp Ramah in the Poconos, Rachel was the Assistant Director at Camp Ramah Darom from 2015 to 2020. Rachel has been a Ramahnik since 1998, when she first became a soccer coach at Ramah Darom. She has a Double Bachelor's Degree in History and Art History from the University of Michigan, and an MA from Emory University in Teaching.



Sami is the Program Director for Camp Ramah in Canada. Growing up in Toronto, she spent her summers, since 2005, at Ramah Canada. Sami has been on staff for many summers, spending the last three as a Rosh Edah. She studied History at Queen's University and also has a degree in Education from York University, with a specialization in the Primary and Junior grades.



Rabbi Cohen is the national director of the Ramah Camping Movement. After graduating from Brown University, Rabbi Cohen attended the NYU School of Law before enrolling in rabbinical school at JTS. Rabbi Cohen worked at Ramah California between 1979 and 1988. He served as director of Ramah Canada for 11 years, 1990-2000. He became national director in 2003.



Avram is the coordinator of the Advah Fellowship (Amitei Ramah Tzeirim) at Ramah Galim, and also serves as Rosh Nachshonim, the camp's oldest edah. Originally from Voorhees, NJ, he is a camper and staff alum of Ramah Poconos. After graduating from Tufts University, Avram served as a JDC Fellow in Mumbai, India and on the staff of Muhlenberg Hillel. He currently attends the Ziegler School of Rabbinic Studies.



Daniella is the assistant director of Ramah Wisconsin, where she has worked on the summer staff since 2014. Most recently, Daniella worked at an Israeli educational NGO for children of asylum seekers, refugees and migrant workers. She has also worked for National Ramah and The Jewish Agency, where she screened and trained future shlichim. Daniella earned her BA in Education, History and Philosophy from Hebrew U.



Rabbi Gelb has served as director of Camp Ramah New England since September of 2005, and C.E.O. since October of 2018. Ed joined CRNE after a successful five-year tenure as director of Camp Alonim in California. Raised in Wyoming, Rabbi Gelb served on the staffs of Ramah California and Ramah Canada for many years. An alumnus of UCLA, Ed was ordained by the Ziegler School of Rabbinic Studies.



Ariel is the program director of the National Ramah Commission. Originally from Evanston, Illinois, Ariel spent 5 summers at Ramah Wisconsin. A graduate of Washington University in St. Louis, Ariel completed the Avodah Jewish Service Corps fellowship in Washington, DC and worked in both homeless services and education before joining National Ramah.



Rabbi Hersh is the camp director of Ramah Day Camp in Nyack and has worked at Nyack since 2000. Ami, an alum of the Wexner Graduate Fellowship, was ordained at JTS in May 2012 and also received an MA in Jewish education from the Davidson School of Jewish Education in 2013. A graduate of the University of Hartford, he holds degrees in elementary education and Judaic studies.



Talya Kalender is the Director of Camper and Staff Care at Ramah New England. A graduate of the Hebrew University in Jerusalem, she lives in Fairfax, VA (when she doesn't live in Palmer). She is a 3rd generation Ramahnick and has been working full-time for CRNE for 12 years.



Audra is the Associate Camp Director and Head of Community Care & Tikvah Support at Ramah Darom. Prior, Audra was the camp director of Camp Firefly in Chicago. Audra received her BA from the University of Michigan and Psy.D. from The Illinois School of Professional Psychology in 1996. Audra has worked with Jewish Child and Family Services since 1997 and is a Certified Autism Specialist.



Pamela is the Program Director at Ramah New England. She has been a Ramahnik since 2007, growing up at Ramah Canada and working at Ramah Nyack on staff and as a Rosh Edah. Pamela graduated from the University of Maryland with a BA in Psychology and was a fellow on the Nachshon Project.



Yael is the Assistant Director for Programming at Ramah California. Yael spent many summers at Ramah California including as a madricha and a rosh edah. Originally from Denver, Yael graduated from the University of Michigan with a BA in organizational studies. Yael loves to travel, go hiking, and spend time with her friends and family.



Paul is the Program Coordinator at Ramah Nyack. He has been at Ramah since he was a camper at Nyack, and then as a camper, counselor, and rosh edah at Ramah Berkshires. Paul studied politics and computer science at Princeton and was a fellow on the Nachshon Project. Paul is best known for his role in the Machon 2013 production of the Prince of Egypt as "the hebrew that Moses saves from the Egyptian."

Aviva is the Director of Camper Care and Staff Wellness at Ramah California, working alongside Ramah's outstanding yoatzim/parent liaisons. An alumna of Brown University, she received her PsyD in clinical psychology from the CA School of Professional Psychology. She has a long history with Ramah California as a chanicha, madricha, rosh edah, and rosh mador. Aviva recently relocated to Skokie, Illinois with her family.



Na'ama is the director of Ramah Israel Seminar. Na'ama was ordained by Rabbi Daniel Landes in Jerusalem and has worked and taught in various educational institutions, including several Ramah camps.
